2. Take the time to read the story in Acts 10 - how God breaks down our pre-conceived ideas of who's in with him and who's not.
3. Why were Jews like Peter instinctively reluctant to reach out to people?
4. Reading Luke 2:10, John 10:16, Acts 1:8, 10:34-35 and Galatians 3:28, why was the time right for that cultural wall to come down?
5. What can we learn about how God designs situations for those who know him to connect with people who don't? Do you anticipate God to connect you with those who need him?
6. Have you ever sensed God prompting you to share the gospel with someone? How did that go? Does that happen often, rarely or what?
7. Sometimes God's movement stalls and that may be because we've erected cultural walls. What group of people do you think you might be reluctant to hang out with?
8. What counsel did Scott give to help us break down walls with people who aren't like us?
