**Title: Cry Fowl**

This series is all about Bob's reflections walking Spain's Camino de Santiago this summer. So, are you a walker or a hiker: maybe a climber, or are you a pro at stumbling out of bed? What's been the longest distance you've ever walked?

1. Last week Bob called us to share what's fresh in our walk with Jesus. Take a minute and *briefly* tell the others what you're learning or experiencing with Jesus.
2. What stood out about the architecture of each Spanish town and city and what implications did Bob draw from that for the church today?
3. In our day and age is it still important for the church to be so important? If the church wasn't a part of your life, what you would be missing?
4. What's at the heart of the Church? Read Philippians 2:9-11 and Acts 4:12. Where did the phrase Solus Christus come from and what does it mean? Anyone recall the other 4 'solai' Bob mentioned and what they mean?
5. Bob soaked up not only the beauty of Spain but its history. Who were the Knights Templar? What's their relationship to Friday the 13<sup>th</sup> and what was their motto? Hint, see Psalm 115:1.
6. The Cathedral-Santo Domingo de la Calzada is unique. Why in the world are live chickens in the cathedral? How is that a parable for the church today?
7. What's the supreme thing, the thing that should always have first place in the church? Theologian Gerald Hawthorne calls Colossians 1:15-20 the ultimate Scripture about Jesus.
8. Slowly read Matthew 28:18 and Colossians 1:15-20. Some say "firstborn" means Jesus was created and as such, he isn't God. What does firstborn actually refer to?

9. Think of some invisible ways Jesus is holding all things together. What can 'holding all things together" thinking, do for our lives? How do we get that thinking inside our heads?
  
10. Like any organization, churches can have mission creep and get off track and on to tangents. Have you seen people or churches do that? How so? How do we as a church keep Christ at the center of all we do?
