1. As you begin, tell each other what God is doing through our 21 days of prayer and fasting.
2. This weekend Bob introduced the series quoting Jeremiah 9:23-24. What stands out to you from that passage?
3. Along that line, he also gave us some theological beef jerky from A. W. Tozer's book The Knowledge of the Holy.
 - "What comes into our mind when we think about God is the most important thing about us." Do you agree, why or why not?
 - "The low view of God... is the cause of a hundred lesser evils everywhere among us." Your thoughts?
 - "The man who comes to a right belief about God is relieved of ten thousand temporal problems." How so? Can you think of example of how this is true?
4. "Let us know; let us press on to know the LORD." Hosea 6:3 (ESV) If we're going to get to know God what's our challenge, our beautiful conundrum? Job 11:7-9, Job 36:26.
5. How is knowing God like reading a "page-turner"? Romans 11:33
6. How do we define an attribute of God? Remember: there are two parts.
7. Reading Acts 17:22-31 draw out as many attributes of God as you can from Paul's 'Truth about God' talk.
8. What observations can you make about how Paul engaged with people who had never heard about Jesus? What was his approach?
9. Do you think your own view of God is too small? If so, where in your life do you sense that's the case? OVER...

10. What does Tozer mean by writing, "To God alone nothing is necessary."
11. If God does need our worship, money, obedience, our surrender, why does he ask us to do these things?
