Let's keep praying together for God to work in and even through the Covid-19 crisis and for racial justice and equity for all.

1. From Hebrews 3:3-6 and Luke 9:28-36, why is it important to see beyond Moses to Jesus when we study his life? Is that good Bible interpretation?
2. One of the twists in the story of Moses is how his mother gave him up and yet ended up raising him for a short period herself (Exodus 2:10-11). Beyond the joy that must have brought his mother and family, what could Moses have learned from her and why might that be significant later?
3. What went wrong and what all did Moses lose when he went out to save his people the first time? Exodus 2:11-14
4. Why was it essential for God to put Moses in the desert for forty years? Wouldn't it have made more sense for God to commission him right away? Why the wait? What good can come from "the far side of the desert?"
5. Have you ever been "desert-ed", put in a place where you're alone and you feel like God's forgotten you? Have you seen some divine purpose to that? Are you there now with Covid-19? Pray for each other. What are you learning these days?
6. What did you learn from the burning bush episode that perhaps you didn't know before?
7. Exodus 19:10—12 and Hebrews 12:29 tell us God is a consuming fire. Why then didn't the fire in the burning bush melt Moses? Hint: think back to the answer to Question 1 and to Exodus 3:2. OVER...

8. What was behind Bob's object lesson of the burning bush? See Colossians 1:27. "Live in the presence of the one who is in us." Bob Marvel

9. From Exodus 3:1-15 a similar question. If we shouldn't ask, "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh", then what question should we be asking? See Isaiah 6:1-3 and 8-9.

10. If this hasn't come up already, how did God speak to you from this week's message?
