Activity

Animal Acting

What You Do

Tell your child, "Let's play a game."
Say, "I'll tell you an action, and you
can act it out. After that, tell me
an animal that does that word you
just acted out. For example, if I say,
'Bounce,' you would bounce up and
down. (Bounce up and down.) Then,
you'd tell me an animal that bounc-
es—like a rabbit or kangaroo! Sound
good? Let's do it!"

Use the following words to play
your game. We've suggested some
animals for each word, but your su-
per-creative kid may think of others,
too!

- slither (snake)
- gallop (horse)
- fetch (throw something and
allow them to bring it back)
(dog)
- roar (lion)
- climb (monkey)
- swim (fish)
- bathe yourself (cat)

To make the game more fun, have
your child come up with some an-
imals on their own. Then, you pre-
tend to be that animal.



Talk about the Bible Story

In the video today, we learned that God made the Earth
and everything in it. Isn't that cool? He's so creative!
Which of the animals that we just acted out is the most
creative?

Besides animals, what else did God create? (*Moon, sun,
stars, mountains, trees, people*)

True or false: God's most creative creation is animals.
(False! God's most creative creation is US—PEOPLE!
He made each of us differently, with unique talents and
skills. He did that on purpose, because people are God's
favorite creation.)

God says that we were made in His image. What do you
think that means? (*We were created to think, feel, and
act at least a little bit like God*)

When you think about it, God dreamed up and created
some incredible things—every flower, every sunset, every
bird you see flying in the sky. God is AMAZING! There is
no limit to His creativity.



Prayer

Use this prayer as a guide, either after talking about
the Bible story or sometime before bed tonight:

"God, thank You for creating the world and everything in
it. You put each star exactly where it is—that's pretty cool
to think about! You are so creative, and we know that
You made us to think like You. That means we're creative,
too! Help us to think about You when we're enjoying the
things You created. Remind us to be thankful to the
One who created it—You! We love You. Amen."

Activity

Color Coding

What You Need

Paper and pencil (optional)

What You Do

Tell your child: "One of us will read a color from a list. Then, we'll go back and forth, naming all the things in nature that are that color. The person who thinks of the last thing wins the round."

Say each color out loud. Go back and forth, naming all the things in nature that are that color. (Example: green—frog, grass, leaves, etc.)

- green
- yellow
- orange
- blue
- purple
- red
- white
- black

If you want a variation, about half-way through the colors, grab a sheet of paper and a pencil for both you and your child. Read the remaining colors aloud. Then, individually, write down as many things in nature that are that color that you can think of. Compare lists. Mark out any items that you both wrote down. Award points for each unique item that each of you thought of. Keep score and reward the winner with a treat!

Talk about the Bible Story

God made the Earth and everything in it. When you think about all the things in nature that God created, which thing amazes you the most?

Think back to the order God created things. What was the last thing God created? (*People.*) What do you think that means about people? (*God saved the best for last; we're His most prized creation.*)

God says that we were made in His image. What do you think that means? (*We were created to think, feel, and act a little bit like God.*)

Think about all the things God created—like sunsets, stars, beaches, kittens, and people. What do all these things say about God's character? (*That He is artistic, funny, brilliant, powerful, loving.*)

If we are created in God's image, what does that say about us? (*That we can do of all those things too!*)

God dreamed up and created incredible things—every flower, every sunrise, every bird you see flying in the sky, and even the beautiful, unique face you see when you look in the mirror. God did that. He is AMAZING! There is no limit to His creativity.

Prayer

Use this prayer as a guide, either after talking about the Bible story or sometime before bed tonight:

"God, thank You for creating the world and everything in it. You painted the sky and the sea with the sound of Your words. We stand in awe of Your power and creativity. And because You created us to think and act like You, we know that we can be creative, funny, artistic, brilliant, powerful, loving, and limitless—all with Your help. Thank You for your incredible creation. We love You. Amen."
